# Opinions on the Church's stand against condom use by the youth

# Is the Church stand against condom use by the youth fuelling the spread of AIDS? by Thengo Kavinya

It has been more than two decades since the HIV virus was discovered, yet the HIV/AIDS pandemic continues to exact a significant toll on Africa. In Africa, an estimated 22 million people were living with HIV at the end of 2007 and approximately 1.9 million additional people were infected with HIV during that year. In just the past year, the AIDS epidemic in Africa claimed the lives of an estimated 1.5 million people in this region. The use of condoms is a known effective means towards preventing the spread of sexually transmitted infections. Most religions, however, frown on the use of condoms by its members. They believe that condoms encourage adultery and promote early sexual debut in the youth. Some religious groups only advocate for condom use by married people as a contraceptive not as protection against sexually transmitted infections or HIV/AIDS. The church believes that the most significant way of preventing AIDS is total abstinence and faithfulness amongst married couples.

I sought opinions from a number of individuals on their view about the current stand by the church on condom use and this is what they had to say:

My answer is no. I'm saying this because I feel the church is right to oppose the use of condoms to unmarried people more especially the youth. I don't think the youth can use condoms two to three times on the other occasion they will decide not to use the rubber again in the end spreading the disease or getting unplanned pregnancies.
